## Schools helped with infrastructure

The Free State Department of Education together with Kagiso Shanduka Trust recently held a Media Walk-About in Parys, celebrating the progress of the KST Basic Infrastructure implemented through the partnership. Among the schools they visited was Barnard Molokoane Secondary School in Parys.

The event was attended by Fezile Dabi District Director Mr Chuta, Finance Deputy Director Mr Moetsela, Rodney Makube KST District Manager, SMGD's, AMT members and school principals.

Schools were motivated for the Annual National Assessment and final matric examination preparations as their performance on these exams will be used to select the schools that will receive incentive based infrastructure.

Barnard Molokaone Principal said "I am very excited about the construction of the ablution blocks, particularly given the capacity of the school. There are 1272 learners and 28 toilets which is a serious health problem. With KST building 189 new ablution blocks this will make a great change".

Twenty six schools are receiving basic Infrastructure in the Fezile Dabi district which is due for completion at the end of October 2014.

These include Grade R classrooms, ablution blocks and extra classrooms.

Five schools are also receiving incentive based infrastructure which is in the form of Libraries, Combi court and Computer Labs.

The partnership between the Free State Department of Education and Kagiso Shanduka Trust recognises the excellence in education requiring a holistic approach to address the needs of South African schools.
